Stories from National Gem & Mineral Show GEMBOREE Willunga 2024

GEMBOREE® Champion Lapidary Trophies: Toowoomba takes all

Participation, patience and persistence has paid off for these three lapidaries who have been cutting for many years. Despite all three men having had a challenging and demanding year, they all resolved to prepare entries for the highest (Level 4) competition in Australia. They were spurred on with the possibility of capturing the top three trophies ... and they did it!!

This year was the 60th anniversary of GEMBOREE[®], held at Willunga, near Adelaide from 29 March to 1 April 2024. The wide range of entries on display including gemstone cutting styles (eg cabochon and faceting), carving and jewellery making showed there are many aspects of lapidary that can be pursued.

OPEN Champion Lapidary winner of the Tom Jenkins Trophy is Dave Radke

This trophy is for the highest aggregate score in the **FIVE** specified Open Sections:

- 1. Standard Cabochon, Specified size, craftsmanship: 98.75%, 2nd place.
- 2. Double Fancy Cabochon, craftsmanship: 90.70%, 1st place.
- 3. Fancy Cabochon, craftsmanship: 89%, 10th place.
- 4. Opal Doublet Flat Top, craftsmanship: 94.45%, 2nd place.
- 5. Standard Brilliant Continuous Girdle: 96.10%, 5th place.

Dave Radke took out Open Champion Lapidary for the sixth time in eight years of entering in the Open Section of Australia's highest level of competition. That required cutting in three cabochon sections, an opal doublet, and a faceted stone. Over the eight years, a total of nine entries achieved top marks of 100%. Dave is a Life Member of the Toowoomba Lapidary Club, has provided Cabochon and Faceting training, and has volunteered time on several management positions since 1997. He is also a Cabochon Judge for Queensland-organised competitions, and a National Faceting Judge.

INTERMEDIATE Champion Lapidary winner of the Harold Evans Trophy is Ron Tillack

This trophy is for the highest aggregate score of in any THREE of the FOUR nominated Intermediate Sections:

- 1. Standard Cabochon, craftsmanship: 92%, 2nd place.
- 2. Fancy Cabochon, craftsmanship: 89.50%, 1st place.
- 3. Commercial Mount Jewellery Pendant: 90.75%, 3rd place.


Ron Tillack first tried his hand at cutting for this Level 4 competition by entering into the 2022 GEMBOREE®, and after achieving a few placings, tried again in 2023 ... and success! Ron was awarded the Norm Patison Trophy (Novice Champion Lapidary) for the highest aggregate score in four-out-of-five nominated Novice Sections. This year, Ron had to cut in Intermediate, and won outright. He also placed a further eleven entries in a number of other Sections with excellent results, scoring 2 x Gold, 3 x Silver and 3 x Bronze medallions. Ron is a Life Member of the Toowoomba Lapidary Club, is a Cabochon cutting instructor and looks after the gemstone cutting machinery as workshop manager. He has held several other management positions over the years since joining in 1988.


NOVICE Champion Lapidary winner of the Norm Patison Trophy is John Duff

This trophy is for the highest aggregate score in any FOUR of the FIVE nominated Novice Sections:

- 1. Standard Cabochon, craftsmanship: 92.90%, 1st place.
- 2. Fancy Cabochon, craftsmanship: 91.45%, 2nd place.
- 3. Double Standard Cabochon, craftsmanship: 92.00%, 1st place.
- 4. Standard Round Brilliant Continuous girdle: 97.51%, 2nd place.

John Duff, after putting entries in other gemstone cutting competitions, with success, tried his hand at the highest level of cutting in Australia. This year, John placed entries in the Novice Section for the very first time. His results speak for themselves: achieving an extremely high standard of cutting. 
